Get ready for a wonderful 2020 with the Olympia Camera Club. Pay your dues and put Saturday, March 28, on your calendar. OCC will have a field trip to Wolf Haven. Club members will be able to see Grey wolves, Mexican Grey wolves, Red wolves and coyotes. This is a private sanctuary visit so it will be available just for active Club members and limited to only the first twenty people. We will allow signups past the first twenty in case someone can't make the field trip. Chuck Paeth (Club member) will be the guide, providing the story of

each wolf and will answer questions. The cost is \$9/ senior (62+), \$11/adult. Please bring the exact amount in cash. There will be a signup sheet at the next few meetings. The signup sheet will have a place to note if you would like to carpool. We



will try to connect those who want to carpool with others.

The sanctuary visit will begin at 10 am. Club members should plan to arrive no later than 9:45 am. The visit will last about 50 minutes. There is plenty of parking at Wolf Haven. We will meet outside of the gift shop. Wolf Haven is located at 3111 Offut Lake Rd. SE Tenino, WA. Club members can get more information by visiting Wolf Haven's website: https://wolfhaven.org/visit/about-your-sanctuary-visit.

The wolves are located in 1/3 acre enclosures. The enclosures are constructed of chain link fencing. We will be anywhere from 20-50 feet from the wolves. Most of the wolves are interested in visitors so they will likely be at the front of the enclosures. There are trees in the enclosures so there can be heavy shade. Photo opportunities will include wolves, coyotes, eagles, ravens and a very interesting fir tree (the Grandfather Tree). Club



members are free to photograph anything at Wolf Haven. The only restrictions are no flash, tripods or monopods. Check the OCC Calendar for updates on this trip.

Quinault Rain Forest Nature Trail Photo Walk March 14, 2020 11:00 a.m. at trailhead

I will lead a walk at the Quinault Nature Trail #855, Olympic National Forest. Website: https://www.fs.usda.gov/recarea/olympic/recreation/hiking/recarea/?recid=47771&actid=50

The half-mile interpretive nature trail traces Willaby Creek through lush terrain & old-growth forest. The trail is compacted gravel and first 850 feet is accessible to individuals in wheelchairs.

A valid <u>Recreation Pass</u> (NW Forest Pass or an Interagency Pass) is required at <u>Quinault Rain Forest Trailhead</u>. Follow the link above to see the accepted passes and where to purchase.

From Aberdeen, WA travel north on US Highway 101 for 45 miles to the junction of South Shore Road. Turn right (east) and drive 1.4 miles to Quinault Rain Forest Trailhead on right side of South Shore Road. Address: S Shore Rd, Quinault, WA 98575

We will meet at the trailhead at 11:00. Bring a lunch and rain clothes.

It is likely to be wet and dark under the tree canopy. Don't let the weather scare you! Wet plant surfaces are fascinating. A circular polarizing filter will help remove the glare and bring out the colors of wet surfaces. You will need a tripod and a 50 mm (Normal) or close-up to mid zoom lens. We will photograph ferns, mushrooms, decay and winter wetness under ancient old growth Douglas firs and cedar trees along the trail. Afterwards, we may move to the Lake Quinault Lodge for a spot of tea. Lodge Phone # (360) 288-2900.

Ridgefield's four mile auto route gave us the chance to see wildlife in their natural habitats. There seemed to be no shortage of wildlife to photograph because the refuge offers sanctuary for numerous birds, frogs, deer, coyotes and other mammals.

Saturday (and a few on Sunday), members captured great photos and many of them were shared on our Facebook page. Bruce Livingston took a photo of a coyote, and Susan Bradley photographed a kingfisher. Both of these I have yet to photograph at Ridgefield. As we drove the loop around the reserve it was exciting to see what we could photograph and compare them to what others were seeing. Pam Hoaglund showed me where to find the Great Horned Owl, and I tried to photograph him but my pictures weren't nearly as good as Pam's and others. Jeff Martin shared his photo of the "Your car is your viewing blind" sign - I just love that sign. I have seen many others at different wildlife refuges but none are as cute as Ridgefield's. Nandita Adhia-Mallo captured deer lying down in the woods, which is something else I didn't see that day.










PSA Photo Festival Colorado Springs, CO September 29 – October 4, 2020

Kenmore Camera Photo Gallery Update

Because several of our members have expressed interest in participating in the Northwest Council of Camera Clubs' **PHOTO GALLERY** at the Kenmore Camera Store our board voted to notify NWCCC that we would participate. The show will be in September and October of 2020. Here are the details:

Deadline for OCC members to RSVP to participate is March 27. We notify NWCCC at their March 7 board meeting that the Olympia Camera club will participate in the gallery.

Each club is asked to submit (1) photo and have in reserve (1) other photo if needed. The gallery holds up to 22 photos, so if any club does not RSVP by April 1, some clubs may be asked to submit two photos. If more than one member submits an image to OCC we will use some method to determine 1st, 2nd, 3rd and so on.

Theme: The store owner is requesting original photos of the Pacific Northwest that are landscapes, wildlife, sports, scenic, or shapes and/or patterns found in nature. No "Altered Reality" or "Creative" images that have been created or heavily manipulated in a computer. No nudes.

Orientation: A portrait or landscape orientation is fine.

Each club or photographer is responsible for the costs of matting and framing the photo(s). Mats must be WHITE (any shade) and frames must be BLACK. No brown wood grain, gold, silver, or any other color than black frames.

Size – no smaller than 12 x18 or larger than 20x24. This measurement is the INSIDE of the frame, i.e. the outside edge of the mat. Rectangles and squares are fine.

Wired – the frame must be wired on the back. See attached photo. Images that are not framed or wired correctly will not be in the gallery.

Sales: Each photo needs the following information. Title, Maker's name, Club Name, photographer's email, phone and (optional) price. Prospective buyers will need to contact the maker directly. Kenmore Camera will not facilitate any sales.

Deadline to submit framed photos: Members who want to participate must bring their print to the May Member Sharing meeting, May 19. Images do not have to be matted or framed at this time. Images selected to go forward can then be matted and framed. Frank Townsend will insure prints are forwarded to NWCCC by July 15, 2020.

Please deliver photo labeled in the upper right corner with Title, Name of Maker, Club name, maker's email and phone number and (optional) price. Photos without this information will not be in the gallery and can't be sold.

Photography Cheat Sheet: Mastering Composition for Landscapes




Before you set your exposure for a landscape photo, make sure your composition is on point. Use this photography cheat sheet as your guide to master working landscape scenes.

Getting the exposure right is only half of the job when it comes to landscape photography; it's just as important to have eye-catching composition. These two elements work together to make an outstanding landscape photo that goes beyond the snapshot. Today's photography cheat sheet is a great resource both for those who are new to shooting landscapes and those who want to keep improving their composition.

Today's photography cheat sheet from <u>Digital Camera</u> <u>World</u> is part of their helpful resource on mastering landscape photography. They wanted to put emphasis on framing a scene right before fussing with the exposure settings. Since the cheat sheet is in flow chart format, it will help you decide how to compose a scene even if you're just starting out shooting landscapes.
