## THE SEATTLE SCIENCE CENTER—(206) 443-2001

During December, The Seattle Science Center, in Seattle Center, is offering a laserlight show with music from Tchaikowsky's Nutcracker Suite.

In the darkened auditorium of the observatory, color laser light beams dance on the domed ceiling presenting a great opportunity for any photographer who likes to create abstract pictures.

### Daytime showings--Saturdays and Sundays

December 1; 7,8; 14,15; 21,22 at 2 P.M., 3 P.M., 4 P.M.

December 23, 24, 25 at 1 P.M., 2 P.M., 3 P.M.

(House rule: The use of flash lights or strobes during the show is not permitted. Note: Don't even think of it, a strobe or flash would give you a plain white ceiling. You will be working in a darkened room. A flashlight will only hasten your exit from the show.

Try to get a seat where you will be close to the center of the action.

Make camera settings before house lights go out.

Start with a fresh roll of medium speed, color slide film.

Set the time on "bulb" and the lens opening at f:4, or wider (your choice).

Cock the shutter, and put the lens cap on. Note: If the lens cap is on the camera or in your hand, you know where it is. If you set it on your lap, and it rolls off somewhere, you may find it after the show.

Set distance on infinity (for sharp images), or set it at a close distance for flowing colors.

To hold the camera steady, use an arm rest or railing.

After the lights are turned down, the laser lights come on, and music begin. It is time to start making exposures. You have options:

To make exposures, release (open) shutter and then remove lens cap, count seconds. To terminate exposure replace lens cap, close shutter, and advance the film. Repeat the cycle for each exposure. (To get the feel of this, I suggest that you practice this procedure a few times at home with no film in the camera.)

Make several exposures on each frame by removing and replacing the lens cap.

Mix exposures on a frame. Sharp images mixed with some that are out of focus.

Long and multiple exposures offer more complex images, short and single image are simple and sparse.

To get erratic movement in your images, move your camera during exposure.

Have fun, experiment.
